Board Report

At its Nov. 4 meeting, the LWVCC board:

1. Completed plans for the consensus meeting on 11-17. Phyllis Black will run it and send a mail flier. Ed Gracely will send an e-mail reminder and serve as recorder.
2. Agreed to reduce paper copies of the Voter to the minimum, and drop our bulk mailing permit to save money.
3. Approved a policy that elected party officials cannot moderate forums.
4. Agreed to work with Camden County College on a variety of fronts.
5. Decided to conduct program planning as in previous years, with breakout groups discussing parts of the positions. Harriet Snyder, Sally Thorne, and Karen Avenick agreed to lead groups. Ed Gracely will coordinate.



Getting there - Directions!

Camden County Courthouse: Take 676 north to Mickle Blvd. Flow right at the fork (don't go on Campbell Place), then turn right onto 5th street in a few blocks. The courthouse is at 5th and Federal, a block up from Mickle.

Camden, Federal Courthouse: 4th and Cooper, but we generally car pool. Call 856-795-7878 if you're interested. *About 3-4 blocks from the City Hall PATCO station.*

Camden, Technology Center 601 Cooper Street. Take 676 north into Camden. Exit at exit 5B towards Camden Business District/Rutgers. This is almost the last exit before the bridge. In a block or two, turn left onto Linden, then in a block, left onto 7th Street. Go over the highway, then right onto Cooper for a block.

Voorhees: Vogelson Regional Library: Driving south on 30, turn left onto Somerdale Road, just above the Echelon Mall. Go under the train bridge in about a half mile, then turn right onto Burnt Mill. Soon turn left onto Laurel Road. The library is on your right. Burnt Mill Road also crosses 544 (Evesham Road) north of the library and White Horse Road (an extension of Springdale) south of it. If you know where the Echelon Mall is, you're home!
