
### Board Report Jan 4, 2016

Greetings fellow League members and friends (who we hope will become members):

So, when did they start naming winter storms? I'm writing this as Jonas rages (sort of, he was raging more last night). And how did we get to "J" already? OK -- in case you're curious, I looked it up. Winter storm naming seems to be a "The Weather Channel" thing, since around 2011. The National Weather Service only names hurricanes. The other notable ones this season (Ajax, the first, and Delphi) were both Midwestern storms. Only some media sources follow TWC's lead.

But the League's work goes on. I see that Missouri is planning to put a voter ID on the ballot for a constitutional change (since their Supreme Court ruled that it is currently unconstitutional). Luckily, no such movement in New Jersey, although the League was disappointed that the Democracy Act was not signed by the governor (nor were key provisions put up for a ballot question).

NJ has vote by mail, which avoids the issue (but may raise others). I asked the County Clerk's office how they maintain confidentiality -- they replied that the signed envelope is separated from the ballot itself, so nobody will know how you voted. However, the fact that you voted in an election is a matter of public record. I suggested that this information be added to the frequently asked questions on the web site (since lots of people may wonder). Let's see if they do!

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## Getting there - Directions!

**Haddon Township: Rohrer Library:** Take 295 to Route 30 north. On 30, pass King's Highway. In about a mile after King's Highway, just after Nicholson Road on the left, you'll see Cuthbert Road on the right. Turn right onto Cuthbert from 30. Stay on Cuthbert for about half a mile. Just past Hopkins, turn right onto MacArthur. The library is at that corner. // This is the same Cuthbert Road that becomes Cuthbert Blvd further north at routes 70 and 38, so you could take it south from there. MacArthur is about 0.8 miles south of Haddon Avenue on Cuthbert Blvd.

**Voorhees: Vogelson Regional Library:** Driving south on 30, turn left onto Somerdale Road just above the Voorhees Town Center. Go under the train bridge in about a half mile, then turn right onto Burnt Mill (at the light). Soon turn left onto Laurel Road at a light. The library is on your right as you pass the mall.
